

DON'T PANIC. PREPARE.



Before a hurricane hits, it is important to be prepared.

All Flagler College students are required to have an evacuation plan.



Make sure to stock up on the following supplies:

1. Plenty of water! It is suggested to have one gallon per person per day.
2. Three day supply of non-perishable food (peanut butter crackers, granola bars, nuts, trail mix, etc).
3. Flashlights and extra batteries
4. First aid kit
5. Cash (ATMs and card readers won't work if the power goes out)
6. Toiletries or medication
7. Cell phone charger and battery pack
8. Passport/Identification in case you have to evacuate
9. Dry, clean clothing and a blanket

PREPPING FOR HURRICANES

The Atlantic Hurricane Season runs from June 1 through November 30. Planning ahead and making a hurricane plan in the event of a storm is the best way to help you prepare. The information contained in this guide is intended to provide a few tips to help you develop a plan.

Tropical Weather Basics

Tropical Depression: winds < 39 MPH

Tropical Storm: winds 39 – 73 MPH

Hurricane: winds > 73 MPH

Warning: conditions are expected somewhere within the warning area. A warning is usually issued 36 hours before the onset of the storm's winds.

Watch: conditions are possible within area. A watch is usually issued 48 hours before the onset of the storm's winds.



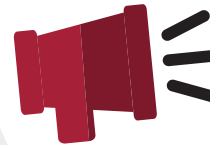
What if a tropical storm or hurricane threatens St. Augustine?

- Flagler College will activate its Hurricane Plan and begin monitoring the storm.
- You should monitor local and national media, as well as watch for College announcements.
- Unless the College is evacuated, the residence halls will remain open and the dining hall will continue to operate during designated hours.
- If power is lost, a backup generator will continue to supply electricity to Ponce Hall and FEC.

Omnilert is Flagler's primary notification means for emergency situations. All students, staff, and faculty are automatically enrolled.

What if Flagler College is evacuated?

Flagler College will not wait until local authorities call for an evacuation. If the Office of the President determines Flagler College could be threatened by a storm, we may evacuate.

- You must leave campus immediately as students, faculty and staff will not be allowed to remain on campus.
- Residential students must sign out before leaving campus and should notify family about plans.
- Flagler will work with students who are in need of transportation.
- If possible, evacuate to the home of a friend or a family member instead of a shelter.
- Leave the area early and do not return until an all clear from Flagler College is received via Omnilert.
